FIRST PLACE. 'Durers Rhino' – Fired to earthenware by Alison Pink




SECOND PLACE. 'Congolese jungle monkey' – Crank and paper clay, stains and oxides. Length 54cm by Jennifer Lowe


"Save me" – Soft pastel, 40x30cm by Donice Sousa

'Cheeky Chimp' – Unfired, hand built using crank clay slabs. 20cm high approx by Carol Read






'It's a jungle out there...' – Glazed, hand built stoneware heads by Sally Foan




"I'm quite friendly really" – Wall plaque in fired crank by Pamela Wood

'Urban Jungle', Inspired by Hundertwasser village in Vienna – Glazed stoneware with underglazes by Jane Ostler




'The Real Macaw' – Stoneware paperclay, bisque fired with underglaze. Height 9 inches by Dorothea Reid
