TALK and DEMO Varvara White: Metal Sculpture

Art was Varvara's most faithful companion since she was very young. It gave her a feeling that she was good at something. It felt natural that she would pursue a career in art.

Varvara's degree from Wimbledon School of Art in 1988 specialised in traditional sculptural methods. She was able to indulge herself in plaster casting, stone carving, wood construction, as well as steel construction, with which she fell in love! The oxyacetylene gas cutter, forge and three phase welding were very seductive, full of danger and excitement.







The focal point in Varvara's sculpture was primarily from an aesthetic point of view, dealing with the space within a space, within the confines of a steel frame. Form, line and space were her focus. She also explored ideas about function and aesthetics within objects which culminated in her degree show, unusable furniture made out of steel - was it art or furniture? One piece was against a wall called Mantel Piece and another Tall Boy - both referring to their wooden counterparts.

In 2016, after doing a silver jewellery course, her work evolved to include copper and now Varvara is predominantly working in this metal, making wall mounted sculptures.

Varvara now feels she has three strands to her work; her fine art copper structures, her craft sculptures e.g. the hare and the fox and her silver and copper jewellery, her copper leaf brooches proving a great hit with the public. Varvara has exhibited in a few exhibitions including our own BPSS

exhibitions!

At the moment Varvara has a sculpture called "Oak Spirit" in the Obsidian Gallery and will be participating in Bucks Arts Week at the Good Earth gallery in Chesham in June 2024. See more of her work at Varvarawhiteart.com

Michele Greene: Mixed Media Sculpture

Michele lives and works from her home in Buckinghamshire. She uses a wide range of media including clay, wire, cement and resin and enjoys incorporating found and recycled objects into her pieces. Clay remains her favourite medium because of its malleability and the close relationship she has when modelling the sculpture so that literally hundreds of her fingerprints become part of the work.



She uses the natural world to help her depict wildlife, her aim is to capture the essence of the subject caught in a moment of time. This is often the way we glimpse

animals and birds when we see them in their natural habitat.

Michele is influenced by her mother, Giacometti, Michael Gormley and Picasso amongst others and her inspiration comes from her family, news and nature. Her mother was a sculptor and her father built her kiln for her in their garden. She had a wonderful pottery and art department at school where she took took it up to A level. After school she came an occupational therapist. Later she went back to school to study Fine Art and became an art teacher.



Michele turns her pots into people and believes all experiences come out in our work. She made a piece called "Forgotten Man" which consisted of fallen branches in the woods - she later cast this in iron resin. Her "Seeking Refuge" piece was made in response to the Afghan war in 2001, she later auctioned the statue for Concert - a charity which helps refugees. Group projects with children from Oxford Youth Art involve making a giant whale from plastic bottles - emphasising their awareness of plastics in the sea.



Michele has come full circle and is now simplifying her figures capturing the life and emotions of the subjects. The stillness of the sculpture combines with a suggestion of body language and movement which easily conveys mood to the audience. She used crank clay to demonstrate her method of building a figure and adapting the body to indicate these different moods and feelings. Michele tells stories with her pieces giving a narrative element to the work. The viewer sees a snapshot of an ongoing situation and is left to imagine the rest of the story.

An expert and very enjoyable demonstration. Michele is a member of Oxford Sculptors and Bucks Art Society and her work is also at the Carina Haslam Gallery and Woburn Art Gallery. www.greenesculpture.com

Templatemaker.nl: A free website where it makes a template for you. Choose the 3D shape you want, add dimensions and click the create button. Print it out and make the shape using the print out and if you like it make it in clay! Enjoy!

Mikkel deMib: A Danish thrower who makes videos covering most aspects of pottery making pit-firing, raku, agateware, texture, stains & oxides etc.

Black Raven Pottery: Creates handmade pottery. A video dated 11/2/24 called 'No pottery wheel needed' shows an alternative way of covering a non porous bowl with an old pair of tights (tuck the excess

inside the bowl) to create a hump mould.
You can stretch the tights to eliminate any
wrinkles that might transfer to your


